- Where the apostrophe is placed can show the difference between singular and plural possession
- Some words by their nature show plurals e.g. children or men both indicate more than one child or more than one man.

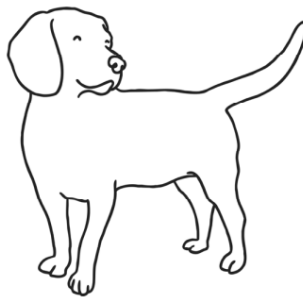
Conor is looking at Isla's bike.
