<p>SPAG</p> 	<p>Cohesion</p> <p>This week we have been looking at how we can create cohesion in different ways. Join these sentences into one sentence which flows using all the cohesive devices we have discussed: reordering/combining clauses, adding subordination, changing the punctuation, vary the verb form.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: The soldier slept. He was very tired. He had travelled far. He dreamed of home. He slept for hours on end.</p> <p><i>The soldier, who was exhausted from his travels, slept for hours, dreaming of home.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Deforestation is a global problem. It is happening fast. It is caused by burning forests, chopping them down or flooding them.2. Big businesses are one of the main causes of deforestation. They want more money. They need space to graze cattle or grow palm oil trees.3. The clock ticked loudly. Time passed slowly. Detention was dull. Tom regretted not doing his homework.

SPAG	<p>If you found the cohesion activity we did in class a little tricky, try the activity below instead.</p> <p>We would like you to create some grammatically accurate sentences. As you will remember, a sentence should have a subject (a noun) and a verb (an action that is happening). You can then add extra elements to help it make sense. You must do at least 8 sentences. Don't forget capital letters and ending punctuation.</p>
