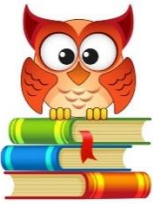
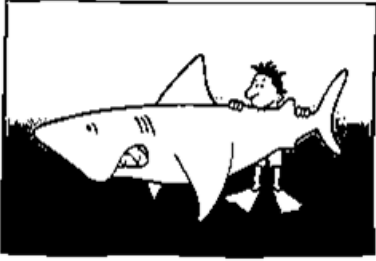
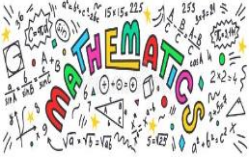


Year 6 Homework w/c 6.12.24
