Subordinating Conjunctions!

This week, we have been learning about subordinate clauses. We have learnt about what main clauses and subordinate clauses are and have looked at how different subordinating conjunctions are used. Remember children (and parents, just in case you're not sure!), main clauses make sense on their own and subordinate clauses don't make sense on their own. Your subordinate clause needs to start with a subordinating conjunction (see the box below) and remember to vary the position of your subordinate clause – some sentences could begin with it and others could end with it. Your sentences should be Christmas themed seeing as it is now December! Write 6 sentences in total, making sure you use each of the subordinating conjunctions below.

since despite however
when although whilst

Examples:

main clause subordinating conjunction subordinate clause
Santa continued to eat mince pies despite having already eaten 500!

subordinating conjunction subordinate clause main clause
Although he had been a little mischievous recently, Rudolph still got chosen to pull Santa's sleigh.
